



### **Frightmare at Over Farm this Halloween – 6 October 2008**

A frightfully good and scary time for all the family is promised at Over Farm Market near Gloucester this Halloween.

'Frightmare' will be taking place at the farm from Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> - Friday 31<sup>st</sup> October and will include 'Frightfully Funny' activities during the day and 'Frightfully Scary' activities in the evening. A percentage of the profits from the event will be donated to a local charity.

'Frightfully funny' will include attractions such as trailer rides to the pumpkin patch to choose a pumpkin before carving your very own Jack O' Lantern, along with the opportunity to take a trip on the quad train rides to the haunted cottage and the zombie alley paintball arena . Kids will be able to have a go on the rides and inflatables available. Afterwards everyone can enjoy the refreshments.

The farm will be transformed from 'Frightfully Funny' during the day to 'Frightfully Scary' at night fall. Attractions will be designed to test the nerves of everyone brave enough to go along. As well as the infamous haunted hayride, they will get the chance to visit the new terrifying haunted cottage and St Mass Acre Monastery. They will also be able to choose a pumpkin, have a drink and grab a bite to eat.

"Over Farm has been running the haunted hayride for nine years this year and it has always proved to be a real success," said Rob Keene, owner of Over Farm Market.

"We thought it would be nice this Halloween to add some extra activities that the whole family can get involved in."

Rob is a trustee of the Old Spot Trust which was set up at the end of last year to help local charities and good causes in Gloucestershire. A percentage of the proceeds from 'Frightmare' will help boost its funds.
